#### Pastor's Corner

ear Sisters and Brothers in Christ, God is good all the time, and all the time .... Hello Christmas It is no longer a secret, Christmas is almost at the corner... Wow. Can you feel it...? Oh I can feel it (and I'm neither referring to the cold nor to the icy snow) haha. Would you like to know what I enjoy most about Christmas? You'd like to guess? ... The snow? The Christmas trees and light? The gifts? Hahaha.. you are not quite wrong, but not quite correct either! Indeed, what I enjoy most about Christmas is the atmosphere of peace, fraternity, sharing and familiarity. Wherever these four

items abound, Christmas becomes monumental, for it brings with it a profound positive change in our lives, in our relationships and in our Community. As we begin this Sunday a new liturgical year (C), we simultaneously celebrate the First

Sunday of the Advent Season. It is a season of hopeful expectation. What are we expecting in hope? While we celebrate the human birth of the eternal Son of God (who is true Man among human beings), we also look forward to his spiritual rebirth within us, hence, in our hearts, in our homes, in our parish Community and, of course, in our dear country, Canada, In the Gospel reading of today (Luke 21), Jesus admonishes us saying: "Be on your guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of life, and that day catch you unexpectedly, like a trap". What day is the Lord pointing to? Jesus refers to the Day of his coming, namely Christmas.

Is the spiritual meaning of Christmas still respected nowadays? Of course, yes; yet, it clearly goes downhill, compared to years back. How is that? It is obvious, is it not? ... It is common experience that most times we find ourselves so engulfed in Christmas multitasking, such as worries about what to wear, what to eat and what to buy, etc., that we forget the most essential part: interior, spiritual rebirth in Christ Jesus, with him and through him! To be born again means to open one's heart to Jesus that he might renew us interiorly; that he might re-energize us and lend us new vision for our lives. For this reason, let us not forget to purify our innermost selves during these four weeks of hopeful expectation. And, since the new born King brings with him the gift of peace, may he find our souls ready to receive that precious gift. In fact, I can tell you that, true peace is the greatest gift we can have for Christmas. Once we are able to lure true peace into our hearts, only then can sharing our meals, gifts, time and treasures obtain genuine significance; which means that we now share from our heart rather than from some sense of obligation. Now Christmas acquires its true meaning!

Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to people of good will. Blessings, Fr. Patrick CCE

#### The Angelus Prayer

The word "Angelus" comes from the Latin "Angelus Domini" meaning "Angel of the Lord". This is a prayer of the Church commonly said three times a day at morning, noon and evening. [Or traditional times at 6 AM, Noon, and 6 PM]. The present-day form of the Angelus traces back to 1560 and is a prayer composed of a short verse followed by a response, and then followed by a Hail Mary. It is an excellent prayer reminding all of Christ's Incarnation to save humanity. If you are praying in a family setting or a group, the leader saying the "V" (verse) parts and you say the "R" (response) part, but if you are praying alone, you will pray the entire prayer. May God bless you as you pray the Angelus. Angelus:

- V: The Angel of the Lord declared unto Mary.
- R: And she conceived of the Holy Spirit.
- All: Hail Mary....
- V: Behold the handmaid of the Lord.
- R: Be it done unto me according to thy word.
- All: Hail Mary...
- V: And the Word was made Flesh.
- R: And dwelt among us.
- All: Hail Mary...
- V: Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.
- R: That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.
- V: Let us pray. Pour forth, we beseech Thee, O Lord, Thy grace into our hearts; that, we to whom the Incarnation of Christ, Thy Son, was made known by the message of an Angel, may by His Passion and Cross, be brought to the glory of His Resurrection. Through the same Christ our Lord.
- All: Amen.
