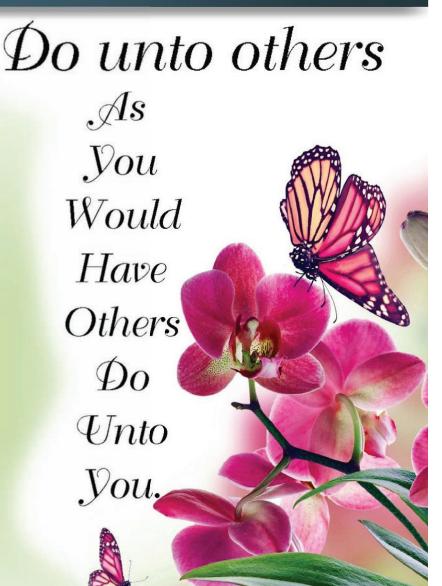

ear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, As we come to the end of February and move into March we also look forward to the penetential season of Lent that will start with Ash Wednesday on March 6th. It might be good to begin the discernment process of how you will use the upcoming Lenten Season to strengthen your faith and growing in your love for Christ and His Church. Here are some ideas that might help you



start your discernment - these ideas for Lent can be for the young and the old:

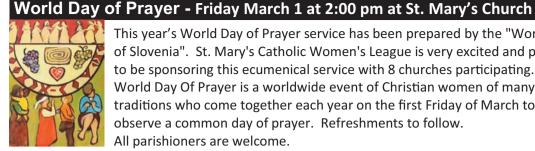
- Make your bed every day.
- Maintain silence in the car or on your walk to class.
- Give up social media.
- Give up Netflix.
- Spend 10-20 minutes in prayer each day. Try to go to the church or to the Adoration chapel.
- Do one thing each day that you don't want to do, for the sake of another: (empty your roommate's trash, wash the dishes, help a friend study for an exam: even if it's inconvenient!).
- Think of 40 people and offer one day of Lent for each person. Be sure to send them a message to let them know.
- Read a spiritual classic. Or two.
- *Heroic Minute get up within one minute of your alarm, kneel down and make a morning offering.*
- Give up the money you'd spend at coffee shops during Lent and donate it to a charity.
- Give up alcohol.
- Give two hours of your time to a local charity once a week.
- Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet each day during the 3 o'clock hour
- Read the Gospel for the day, choose one word that strikes you, write it down and tape it above your desk or on your fridge.
- No salt.
- Give up condiments. Coffee creamer, mustard, salsa...
- No coffee.
- Sleep on the floor.
- Give up your pillow
- Take cold showers (If you can't handle this then at the end of your shower, turn the water to cold and say a Hail Mary).
- Do a bread and water fast on Wednesdays and Fridays.
- Put a popcorn kernel or small rock in your shoe and pray each time.
- Park in the farthest parking spot away from class, at the store or movies. Offer your long walk as a sacrifice.
- Arrive 15 minutes early for mass each Sunday and pray with the daily readings.
- Go to confession!
- Attend one extra daily Mass each week.
- Invite a different friend to mass each Sunday.
- Don't eat out and give the money you'll save to a charity.
- Pray the Rosary each night, with your friends or family if possible.

There are many, many more suggestions I could have included, but what you do needs to be what you feel God is calling "you" to do. Whatever you do, please "DO" something for Lent. And when you do, Lent will then become a true Season of Grace.
