Pastor's Corner

The Stations of the Cross during Lent can be a wonderful way for us to enter into the Passion, and death of Jesus Christ our Lord. The tradition of praying the Stations of the Cross is long and filled with much meaning. Other names for this devotion is called Via Crucis



(Way of the Cross), and Via Dolorosa (Way of Sorrows). Churches began to place on the church walls depictions of the journey that Jesus took from Pilot's Praetorium to the hill of Calvary. As this devotion began to develop, 14 "Stations" became the norm for what we now know as the Stations of the Cross. Since many Christian faithful could not make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land (i.e. Jerusalem), the Stations became the next best option – to "pray the stations" was a way to being spiritually connected to Jerusalem and the holy places our Lord walked his final journey to the Cross.

Although people can pray the Stations of the Cross, whenever they wish throughout the year, yet during Lent the Stations take on added significance. And since Friday is recognized as the Day the Lord walked along the Via Crucis, most parishes like our own, encourage communal Stations of the Cross devotions. Every Friday during Lent we gather to walk the Via Dolorosa as a community after our 7pm evening mass (i.e. 7:30pm). And every year it seems that more and more people come to participate in this ancient and emotional devotion of our Catholic faith.

To pray the Stations, one can simply approach the first Station (i.e. Christ is condemned by Pilot to death) and while genuflecting to say "We adore you Oh Christ and we praise you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world". Then you can spend a few moments reflecting on the Station and conclude with an "Our Father", "Hail Mary" and the "Glory Be". Then you move to the second station and repeat the same acts and words until you have completed all 14 Stations (i.e. this may normally take you about 15 mins.). There are many pamphlets found in the internet that can help you pray the stations. You might wish to print off a couple of pamphlets that speak to your heart and use them as you do your private Stations of the Cross.

And so, I encourage you to consider as part of your Lenten exercises to include the Stations of the Cross, either privately done, or in with our parish community on Fridays at 7:30pm. Blessings,
