







This weekend my pastor's corner is filled with the Liturgy that families can use to bless their homes

this year.

I invite all families to make a concerted effort to bless their homes this year and invite Jesus, Mary and Joseph to reside in your homes. I further invite families to have hung in their homes symbols of our faith. Each Catholic home should have at least one cross (it is best if it is near the entrance of the

home). Consideration should also be made to have the image (either a statue or picture) of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Families need all the protection they can get and 'Sacramentals' (i.e. "sacred signs which bear a resemblance to the Sacraments") can help us call forth the presence of God and his Saints.

Prayer for House Blessing

This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany. The Gospel speaks of the Wise Men, the bright star and the Holy Family. This feast reminds us that Jesus came for "ALL" of humanity...and this is signified by the three Wise Men from the East. It is a custom to invite "peace" in the homes we live in. Since, it is impossible for us priests to bless all your homes, we invite you to bless your own homes using the "House Blessing Liturgy" below.

House Blessing Liturgy

On entering your home

Leader (Parent): Peace be to this house.

All: And to all who dwell in it.

Together: From the east came the Magi to Bethlehem to adore the Lord; and opening their treasures they offered precious gifts: gold for the great King, incense for the true God and myrrh in symbol of His burial.

Leader: Let us now pray, the prayer Jesus taught us

Together: Our Father...

Leader: Let us ask Mother Mary and St. Joseph her husband, to pray for us this year, that we too may be holy as they were.

Together: Hail Mary...

Leader: Let us pray. O God, we ask you to bless this home, that those who live in it may experience health, peace and goodness. May we always strive for family unity and not division. May we be given the graces to build up your kingdom and may it begin here in our home amongst our family. We ask this in the name of God's only Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

All: Amen

After the prayer of the blessing is recited, each room of your home is then sprinkled with Holy Water. The initials of the Magi are inscribed upon the exterior door of the house with chalk. (The initials C, M, B can also be interpreted as the Latin phrase "Christus mansionem benedicat" which translates "Christ bless this house".

The year 2020 provides the beginning and the end of the inscription.

Example: **20 C M B 20**




