Pastor's Corner

ear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let us continue our reflection on the Eucharist and its importance for the Church and the World.

A few weeks ago, I wrote about the possible reasons why many Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence (that the Eucharist is JESUS CHRIST – that His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity is present under the species of bread and wine), but rather see the Eucharist symbolically as our brothers and sisters in other Christian traditions believe.

The possible reasons that I raised why Catholics misunderstand the Eucharist were;

- A lack of education of the Catholic faith.
- An unwillingness to believe in Church Teaching on the subject.
- An inability to believe that God can be truly and substantially present in the bread and wine.
- A fear of what the personal consequences would be if they were to believe what the Church teaches.
- And finally, that believing the Eucharist as a symbol and not the True Presence makes it much easier to excuse oneself from the "practice of the faith".

After reading my Pastor's Corner, a parishioner suggested that I might have missed another very important reason for the lack of belief in the True Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. This parishioner added the following:

• That belief in Science has also led a good number of Catholics to stop practicing their faith and to question many of the beliefs that the Church holds, which includes the True Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharistic Species.

Sadly, there is much truth to what this parishioner suggested. Science has come to be seen in opposition to Faith and Reason (to Religion). All belief that cannot be explained scientifically is thrown out. Since Science cannot explain the Virgin Birth, the Miracles Jesus performed, the Resurrection and of course the 'Transubstantiation' of the bread and wine at Mass, then these cannot be true.

The modern man/woman appears to set a clear distinction between Sciences and faith. But from the very begins of our Catholic Faith, this has not been so. For the greater part, the Catholic Church has been a promoter of the Scientific search for the truth of things. History is lost among our youth who forget that many of the scientific discoveries have come from members of the Church clergy itself. Take for example the 'Big Bang Theory' – it was first proposed by Msgr. Georges Lemaitre who was a Jesuit- educated Belgian Catholic priest, mathematician, astronomer and professor of physics at the Catholic University of Louvian. Yes, to think that the Church has been anti-Science is to be ignorant of history.

As Science continues to make strides each day, so too does the reality that some things will never and can never be explained. Science can only go so far. Faith and reason must take us the rest of the way to the Truth.

Those who see a clash between Science and Religious Beliefs seek proof as the only bases of their direction in life. Indeed, Science becomes their 'Religion'. But the truth is that this desire for scientific proof will always leave them wanting for more, because Science will never answer all the questions they have. Science may look into the Universe and answer many of its secrets, but it will never be able to answer 'WHY' the universe actually exists at all. The answer can only be found in the soul of the one who seeks God.

There are limitations inherent in the "Religion of Science" and the simple act of baking a cake shows this to be so. This example of baking a cake comes from the wonderful Christian evangelizer Nicky Gumbel in one of his ALPHA videos. Nicky states that if a cake is given to a scientist to analyze, the scientist would be able to explain 'how' the cake was made and possibly 'when' the cake was made. But the scientist would not be able to answer 'who' made the cake and 'why' the cake was made. Only the 'creator' of the cake could answer these questions. This simple example of baking a cake shows us that science has limitations and scientists know this to be so. This is why many scientists are faith-filled people who believe in a Creator and understand that Science cannot answer all questions.

Let us pray that Science will continue to answer many of the questions we have regarding the mysteries of the universe. But at the same time, let us not be led by the Evil One to believe that Science is the 'be all' and 'end all' of what we can know as Truth.
