Cantalamessa's Second Advent sermon: Faith in eternity helps create a fraternal world

Last week, in his first Advent sermon, Cardinal Cantalamessa reflected on the meaning of death. This week, he invited his listeners to meditate on another truth that the pandemic has brought back to the surface, that of the "instability and transience of all things." "Everything," he said, "is transitory: wealth, good health, beauty, physical strength..."

Guarantee of eternity - the risen Christ

For Christians, Cardinal Cantalamessa explained, faith in eternal life is based on a precise fact: the resurrection of Christ and His promise. Jesus said, "In my Father's house there are many dwelling places.

Secularization

Secularization brought this process to completion, bringing about the "separation between the kingdom of God and the kingdom of Caesar." It brought in a "whole set of social attitudes that are hostile to religion and to faith," so much so that "the afterlife has turned into a joke," as Kierkegaard put it.

Eternal life and evangelization

According to the papal preacher, faith in eternal life is one of the conditions that make evangelization possible, which is why Paul says, "If Christ has not been raised, then empty [too] is our preaching; empty, too, your faith..."

Preparing for life hereafter

Cardinal Cantalamessa used an analogy to show the need to rediscover faith in life after death. He said it would be silly for a person who has received an eviction order to spend all his money on renovating the house he is leaving instead of the house he is moving into. Likewise, it would be silly for us, who are asked to leave this world, to "only think about decorating our earthly home, without caring about doing good works which will follow us after our death."

An Heaven will reinforce what we already know of Christ and Mary

Our Lady of Loreto is the title of the statue of the blackened Virgin found in the Holy House. By the 1600s, a beautiful "Litany of Loreto" enumerating Mary's biblically rich and theologically evocative titles became a popular Catholic devotion. In October 2019, Pope Francis went on pilgrimage to Loreto and announced that December 10 would henceforward be the Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Loreto on the Church's universal calendar. The formal decree instituting the change



states that the new feast "will help all people, especially families, youth and religious to imitate the virtues of the perfect disciple of the Gospel, the Virgin Mother, who, in conceiving the head of the church also accepted us as her own."



Guadalupe: The Miracle and the Message



The most important event in the evangelization of the New World occurred in December, 1531. Over the course of four days, the Virgin Mary, under the title of

Our Lady of Guadalupe, appeared to an indigenous convert named Juan Diego. As a result of this encounter, and the image miraculously imprinted on Juan Diego's tilma (cloak), nine million Native Americans embraced the Catholic faith, and the Americas began its transformation into the Catholic hemisphere. Our Lady of Guadalupe's message of love had replaced the institutionalized violence

of the Aztec culture and built a bridge between two worlds.
