Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Have you asked yourself.....?

4.- Is the light of reason alone sufficient to know the mystery of God?

In coming to a knowledge of God by the light of reason alone man experiences many difficulties. Indeed, on his own he is unable to enter into the intimacy of the divine mystery. This is why he stands in need of being enlightened by God's revelation, not only about those things that exceed his understanding, but also about those religious and moral truths which of themselves are not beyond the grasp of human reason, so that even in the present condition of the human race, they can be known by all with ease, with firm certainty and with no admixture of error.

COMMENT BY MONSIGNOR JOSÉ IGNACIO MUNILLA:

“In the previous point of the compendium, we affirmed how God has given us a reason with the capacity to know the existence of God; however, at this point, it is not that I say the opposite, but it nuances it, because it is true that our rational capacity is also touched by the sin itself that blinds us. Just as the original sin and our personal sins make it difficult for us to love, they also cloud our reason and make it difficult for us to know the truth. Therefore, let us say that God has had mercy on us, mercy on this understanding that finds it difficult to know the truth and has wanted to show itself, has wanted to take a giant leap that not only leaves us with natural knowledge but also that He has wanted to reveal Himself. The difference between the natural knowledge of God (what we know of God from our capacities) and the revealed knowledge of God (God is discovered) is immense. Therefore, this revelation shows us things that reason could not come to know. But also, as this point It says that this revelation also allows us to know aspects that reason already knew, trained to know, but that we did not have sufficient certainty, ease, and were not exempt from possible errors.”

“Para conocer a Dios con la sola luz de la razón, el hombre encuentra muchas dificultades. Además no puede entrar por sí mismo en la intimidad del misterio divino. Por ello, Dios ha querido iluminarlo con su Revelación, no sólo acerca de las verdades que superan la comprensión humana, sino también sobre verdades religiosas y morales, que, aun siendo de por sí accesibles a la razón, de esta manera pueden ser conocidas por todos sin dificultad, con firme certeza y sin mezcla de error”

COMENTARIO DE MONSEÑOR JOSÉ IGNACIO MUNILLA:

“En el punto anterior del compendio afirmábamos cómo Dios nos ha dado una razón, con capacidad de conocer la existencia de Dios; sin embargo, en este punto, no es que diga lo contrario, pero lo matiza, porque es cierto que nuestra capacidad racional está también tocada por el propio pecado que nos ofusca; igual que el pecado original y nuestros pecados personales nos dificultan nuestra capacidad de amar, también el pecado original y nuestros pecados personales nos ofuscan la razón y nos dificultan el conocimiento de la verdad. Por lo tanto, digamos que Dios ha tenido misericordia de nosotros, misericordia de este entendimiento al que le cuesta conocer la verdad y ha querido mostrarse, ha querido dar un salto de gigante, que es, no dejarnos únicamente con un conocimiento natural, sino que ha querido, revelarse Él. La diferencia entre el conocimiento natural de Dios (lo que nosotros conocemos de Dios desde nuestras capacidades), o el conocimiento revelado de Dios (Dios se descubre), es inmensa. Por tanto, la revelación nos muestra cosas que la razón no podría llegar a conocer. Pero además también, como dice este punto, la revelación también nos permite conocer mas aspectos que la razón ya lo sabía, capacitada para conocer, pero que no teníamos la suficiente certeza, facilidad, y no estábamos exentos de posibles errores.”

Saint Francis of Paola, Hermit 1416-1507

He lived a perpetual Lent

Today's saint, the Padre Pio of his era, was a holy priest from the town of Paola in Southern Italy. He was baptized as Francis by his parents when, after several years of going childless, they made a vow to name any son that might be born to them in the great saint's honor. Francis of Paola was worthy of his namesake from a young age. His parents took special care with his religious upbringing and brought him to live for a year in a Franciscan monastery when Francis was just twelve. The young Francis developed a reputation for holiness even when just a teen. By the age of twenty, he was living as a hermit in a cave near Paola when local men began to gather around him. The fledgling group adopted the name "the Hermits of Brother Francis of Assisi," a name later changed to the "Friars Minims," or just "Minims," meaning "less" or "least," in the spirit of the "Lesser Brothers" that Saint Francis of Assisi had founded centuries before.

Saint Francis of Paola, you lived an integrated life deeply united to God, nature, and your fellow man. Intercede before the Trinity in heaven on our behalf, assisting us to grow closer to God through death to self, through prayer and through a deep attachment to Christ.

A View from a Marriage

What... God has joined together, let not man separate...
Matthew 19:6

A tragedy is a story that begins well but ends badly, A comedy is a story that begins badly and ends well (think of episodes of *I Love Lucy*). Too many of our marriages are tragedies: they begin well, but end badly. The spillover effect of pain, loss and anger is impossible to measure. Two sinners who bring their brand of sin into this mysterious union will begin messing it up before the ink's dried on the certificate. What's a marriage to do? Any marriage seeking to endure "until death do us part" will ask to be placed on the Rock, which is Christ. The storms come, the winds howl, the rain feels like steel pellets, but the marriage remains, because it's not built on nothing. It's built on solid rock. We ask: "What's so special about this Rock?" The answer is two hard things: confession and forgiveness for the sake of Jesus. Simple, yes, but simply profound. With confession and forgiveness there's hope, but without them, it's like you are on shifting sand.

**Lord, you have placed our marriage—and all our relationships—on the Rock of your forgiveness. Keep us there.

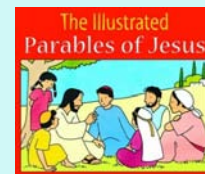
