## Religious Education and Faith Formation

### Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Have you asked yourself.....?

#### 5. How can we speak about God?

By taking as our starting point the perfections of man and of the other creatures which are a reflection, albeit a limited one of the infinite perfection of God, we are able to speak about God with all people. We must, however, continually purify our language insofar as it is image-bound and imperfect, realizing that we can never fully express the infinite mystery of God.

#### Comment by monsignor Jose Ignacio Munilla:

"On the one hand, to be able to talk about God, you don't need to be a professional. If you think that to talk about God you have to be a theologian (or have done some studies), you're wrong. God is more intimate to us than our intimacy, therefore we are going to talk about what is intimate, the most intimate, about who has given us life. It is therefore important to speak of God because the mouth speaks of the abundance of the heart, and it is normal that he who has God in his heart, expresses it and speaks of God, of one or another way, in the testimony of His life. Now, it is important to realize that the things we say about God, obviously we must try to purify them: God will always be more than what we express, our words will always fall short, which does not mean that we do not speak. It means that we have to speak humbly because God is greater than our ability to understand Him".

#### 5.- ¿Cómo se puede hablar de Dios?

#### Comentario de Monseñor José Ignacio Munilla

Por una parte, para poder hablar de Dios, no se necesita ser un profesional. Si uno piensa que para poder hablar de Dios hay que ser teólogo, haber hecho unos estudios, se equivoca. Dios es más íntimo a nosotros que nuestra propia intimidad, por lo tanto, vamos a hablar de lo que es íntimo, lo más íntimo, de quién nos ha dado la vida.

Es por tanto importante, hablar de Dios, porque de la abundancia del corazón habla la boca, y es normal que aquel que tiene a Dios en su corazón, lo exprese, le salga por los poros, y hable de Dios, de una u otra manera, en el testimonio de su vida. Ahora bien, es importante caer en cuenta de que las cosas que decimos de Dios, obviamente hay que intentar purificarlas: Dios será siempre más, de lo que expresamos, siempre nuestras palabras se quedarán cortas, lo cual no quiere decir que no hablemos, quiere decir que tenemos que hablar con humildad, porque Dios es superior a nuestra capacidad de entenderle.

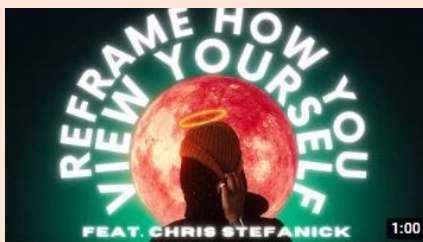
**There was little he did not know**

As a youth, Isidore received an excellent classical education in the Roman tradition, similar to the classical learning Saint Augustine imbibed two centuries before him and utilized to such great effect. Yet Isidore not only learned a great deal, he also remembered it and was uncommonly dedicated to his intellectual pursuits, writing numerous weighty tomes. The breadth and depth of his learning were without equal in his time. It was simply said that Isidore, Archbishop of Seville, knew everything. He is considered by many to be the last of the Latin Fathers of the Church, those early Christian theologians whose writings are the gold standard for all subsequent theologians.

*Saint Isidore, you used your education and knowledge to great effect to evangelize a people. Help all who seek your intercession to unite their learning with zeal for the good of the Church and the many peoples it serves.*

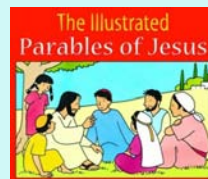
- **Diversify your diet** – cook at home more.
- **Eat more plant-based meals** – enjoy more peas, beans, lentils and chickpeas.
- **Eat local** – check which of your local farmers produces food sustainably.
- **Eat seasonal** – choose foods that are available in season.
- **Buy sustainably produced foods** – learn about practices and labels.
- **Buy or order only what you can finish or save; don't waste** – you paid for all of it. Don't throw your money in the waste bin.
- **Avoid excessive packaging** – purchase items in glass or recyclable material.
- **Talk about healthy and sustainable food with your vendors and producers.**
- **Farm, grow, plant!** – start an urban garden, school garden or kitchen garden.
- **Support organizations, policies and programs that promote sustainable food systems** – share tips with your family & friends.

For a healthy planet, healthy body and a healthy future, it's important that we each look do our part at including sustainable foods in our diet.
