



## Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Have you asked yourself.....?

### 5. How can we speak about God?

By taking as our starting point the perfections of man and of the other creatures which are a reflection, albeit a limited one of the infinite perfection of God, we are able to speak about God with all people. We must, however, continually purify our language insofar as it is image-bound and imperfect, realizing that we can never fully express the infinite mystery of God.

### Comment by monsignor Jose Ignacio Munilla:

"On the one hand, to be able to talk about God, you don't need to be a professional. If you think that to talk about God you have to be a theologian (or have done some studies), you're wrong. God is more intimate to us than our intimacy, therefore we are going to talk about what is intimate, the most intimate, about who has given us life. It is therefore important to speak of God because the mouth speaks of the abundance of the heart, and it is normal that he who has God in his heart, expresses it and speaks of God, of one or another way, in the testimony of His life. Now, it is important to realize that the things we say about God, obviously we must try to purify them: God will always be more than what we express, our words will always fall short, which does not mean that we do not speak. It means that we have to speak humbly because God is greater than our ability to understand Him".

Es por tanto importante, hablar de Dios, porque de la abundancia del corazón habla la boca, y es normal que aquel que tiene a Dios en su corazón, lo exprese, le salga por los poros, y hable de Dios, de una u otra manera, en el testimonio de su vida. Ahora bien, es importante caer en cuenta de que las cosas que decimos de Dios,

obviamente hay que intentar purificarlas: Dios será siempre más, de lo que expresamos, siempre nuestras palabras se quedarán cortas, lo cual no quiere decir que no hablemos, quiere decir que tenemos que hablar con humildad, porque Dios es superior a nuestra capacidad de entenderle.

Yet Isidore not only learned a great deal, he also remembered it and was uncommonly dedicated to his intellectual pursuits, writing numerous weighty tomes. The breadth and depth of his learning were without equal in his time. It was simply said that Isidore, Archbishop of Seville, knew everything. He is considered by many to be the last of the Latin Fathers of the Church, those early Christian theologians whose writings are the gold standard for all subsequent theologians.

Saint Isidore, you used your education and knowledge to great effect to evangelize a people. Help all who seek your intercession to unite their learning with zeal for the good of the Church and the many peoples it serves.


- **Diversify your diet** cook at home more.
