

CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Level I, Part A Formation Course (children ages 3-6)

"Help me to come closer to God, by myself."

This first half of this introductory course for adults will explore the foundations of an internationally recognized approach to the religious education of children known as the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd highlights essential aspects of the Christian message that nurture a child's need to love and be loved and a child's capacity to enjoy God's presence in his or her life.

The Level 1 formation course offers an orientation to the theological concepts fundamental to this ministry with children. It introduces the foundational biblical and liturgical themes that we present to children, through a combination of conversation, reflection and presentation -- these delivered as we would share them with children. The course also offers opportunities to work with Montessori-style, catechetical materials that have been designed to nurture children's prayer.

This 90-hour course is especially designed for those who are interested in or already involved in caring for the spiritual lives of children, in a home, parish or school setting. It is a prerequisite for further adult formation courses in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Certificate Program (Levels II and III).

Completion of both Level 1, Part A (45 hours) and Level 1, Part B (45 hours) is required for certification.

Have you asked yourself.....?

7. What are the first stages of God's Revelation?

From the very beginning, God manifested himself to our first parents, Adam and Eve, and invited them to an intimate communion with Himself. After their fall, God did not dismiss His revelation to them but promised salvation for all their descendants. After the flood, God made a covenant with Noah, a covenant between Himself and all living beings.

Comment by Monsignor José Ignacio Munilla

God created Adam and Eve placing them in a state of unimaginable grace in which they lived in full intimacy with God. They enjoyed His presence, and yet, the terrible drama of sin broke and changed that intimacy. Before sin, Adam and Eve were always in the presence of God, but when they sinned, they hid from God. When sin took place, intimacy with God ceased (because sin is the loss of that intimacy with God). At the same time the good news is that God announced salvation and the beauty is that sin does not have the last word.

Comentario del Monseñor José Ignacio Munilla

A Adán y Eva, Dios les crea constituyéndoles en un estado de gracia impresionante, en la que ellos vivían en la plena intimidad con Dios, gozaban de la presencia de Dios, y sin embargo, el drama terrible del pecado rompe, cambia aquella situación de intimidad tan cercana que tenían con Dios y, curiosamente, en el momento en el que pecan, se esconden. Antes del pecado, Adán y Eva estaban en la presencia de Dios, en el momento en que pecan, se esconden, no pueden estar ante la presencia de Dios, no pueden aguantar la mirada de Dios. Lo que es hermoso es que, en el mismo momento en que acontece ese drama, el drama de la ruptura de la intimidad del hombre con Dios (habíamos recordado que la revelación era el comunicarnos que estábamos llamados a participar de la intimidad de Dios), que es el gran drama, es el drama por antonomasia, es el pecado (porque el pecado es la pérdida de esa intimidad con Dios), en ese momento, la buena noticia consiste en que Dios anuncia una salvación. Dios anuncia que ese pecado que ha acontecido, ese drama que ha acontecido no va a tener la última palabra.

Divine Mercy True power pardons


Mercy is a superabundance of justice, not an exception to it. When faced with a wound to the common good, those responsible for repairing the damage do not have two contrary options: justice or mercy. Justice and mercy are not mutually exclusive. Mercy is a form of justice.

Mercy does not ignore the tears to the fabric of the common good slashed by crime and sin. Rightful authority notes the torn fabric, weighs the personal responsibility of the accused, and distributes justice precisely by granting mercy. Mercy does not turn a blind eye to justice, but fulfills its obligations to justice by going beyond them. After all, one cannot be absolved of having done nothing. Similarly, where there is no guilt there is no need of mercy.

Divine Mercy, do not hold our sins against us. Be a merciful Father who judges us in the fullness of Your power, punishing when needed, but granting mercy when we need it more, most especially when we are too saturated with pride to request it.
