

# Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church

Have you asked yourself.....?

#### Nº 18 Why does Sacred Scripture teach the truth?

We say that Sacred Scripture teaches the truth because God Himself is its author: that is why we affirm that it is inspired and teaches without error the truths necessary for our salvation. The Holy Spirit inspired the human authors of Sacred Scripture, who have written what the Spirit has wanted to teach us. The Christian faith is not a "religion of the book," but of the Word of God, which is not "a written and silent word, but the Incarnate and living Word" (St. Bernard of Clairvaux).

We affirm, forcefully, that the ultimate author of Sacred Scripture is God Who has been inspired by the Holy Spirit to the point that we believe in inerrancy; the word inerrancy means that we believe in the absence of errors in Sacred Scripture. In the Sacred Scripture we see that God has guaranteed an inerrancy, to be preserved from error, because he has God as the ultimate author.

# COMMENT BY MONSIGNOR JOSE IGNACIO MUNILLA

Remember that Sacred Scripture itself says, "Heaven and earth will pass, but my words will not pass." We have to distinguish that the words of men are full of theories, that there has been a great evolution in the thought and word of men: when we say one thing, sometimes we have to admit contrary things, and yet the Gospel that this Sunday has been proclaimed is the same in the past two thousand years. The Word of God has not contradicted Itself in these two thousand years, it is the same and remains the Living and Real Word for each one of us. One of the great differences between the Word of God and the word of man is that the Word of God is eternal, His Word does not make mistakes, does not contain errors like the word of men, which is transitory, imperfect and has many errors. Many times the words of men say one thing and then they are not able to realize it. The Word of God actually happens, It has that gift, which only God can give us.

### Compendio del Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

¿Te has preguntado.....?

### Nº 18 ¿Por qué decimos que la Sagrada Escritura enseña la verdad?

Decimos que la Sagrada Escritura enseña la verdad porque Dios mismo es su autor: por eso afirmamos que está inspirada y enseña sin error las verdades necesarias para nuestra salvación. El Espíritu Santo ha inspirado, en efecto, a los autores humanos de la Sagrada Escritura, los cuales han escrito lo que el Espíritu ha querido enseñarnos. La fe cristiana, sin embargo, no es una "religión del libro", sino de la Palabra de Dios, que no es "una palabra escrita y muda, sino el Verbo encarnado y vivo" (San Bernardo de Claraval).

Afirmamos, con contundencia, que el autor último de la Sagrada Escritura, es Dios. Dios ha hablado, ha sido inspirada por el Espíritu Santo hasta el punto de que creemos en la inerrancia; la palabra inerrancia quiere decir, que creemos en la ausencia de errores en la Sagrada Escritura. Es una cualidad el estar exento del error. En La Sagrada Escritura vemos que Dios ha garantizado una inerrancia, ser preservada del error, porque tiene a Dios como el autor último.

#### COMENTARIO DE MONSEÑOR JOSÉ IGNACIO MUNILLA

Acordaos de que la propia Sagrada Escritura dice, "cielo y tierra pasarán, pero mis palabras no pasarán". Nosotros tenemos que distinguir que las palabras de los hombres están llenas de teorías, qué gran evolución ha habido en el pensamiento y en la palabra de los hombres: cuando decimos una cosa, a veces hemos tenido que ir admitiendo cosas contrarias y, sin embargo, el Evangelio que este domingo se ha proclamado es el mismo en estos dos mil años. La Palabra de Dios no se ha contradicho en estos dos mil años, es la misma y sigue siendo Palabra Viva y real para cada uno de nosotros. Una de las grandes diferencias entre la Palabra de Dios y la palabra del hombre es que la Palabra de Dios es eterna, que la Palabra de Dios no comete errores, no contiene errores como la palabra de los hombres, que es transitoria, es imperfecta y tiene muchos errores. La palabra de Dios, otra gran característica, es que hace lo que dice, sin embargo, muchas veces las palabras de los hombres dicen una cosa y luego no son capaces de realizarla. La Palabra de Dios en realidad acontece, tiene ese don, que solamente Dios puede darnos.


