N° 22 ¿Qué importancia tiene el Nuevo Testamento para los cristianos?

El Nuevo Testamento, cuyo centro es Jesucristo, nos transmite la verdad definitiva de la Revelación divina. En él, los cuatro Evangelios de Mateo, Marcos, Lucas y Juan, siendo el principal testimonio de la vida y doctrina de Jesús, constituyen el corazón de todas las Escrituras y ocupan un puesto único en la Iglesia.

COMENTARIO DE MONSEÑOR JOSÉ IGNACIO MUNILLA

(Transcripción aproximada del audio)

Se subraya el hecho de que el Nuevo Testamento es la culminación de la Revelación, es la Revelación definitiva de Jesucristo. Es bueno recordar que ese Nuevo Testamento incluye los cuatro Evangelios, el libro de los Hechos de los Apóstoles, las cartas Paulinas, las cartas Apostólicas y el libro del Apocalipsis. Todo ellos conforman el Nuevo testamento y todo es, esa culminación de la Revelación, que tiene como centro a Jesucristo. Esto es importante decirlo, porque a veces, podríamos cometer un error, y afirmar que hacemos una opción evangélica, y cuando utilizamos la palabra evangélico, estamos como excluyendo las cartas de San Pablo, lo cual sería absurdo, pues las cartas de San Pablo forman parte, también, del Nuevo Testamento. Por ejemplo, San Carlos de Foucauld, tiene una famosa expresión que dice: "Si no vivimos el Evangelio, Jesús no vive en nosotros. Pero, sería incorrecto interpretar, ese "no vivir el Evangelio", excluyendo el resto de los libros del Nuevo Testamento. Cuando decimos "vivir el Evangelio", es como designar el conjunto del Nuevo

Testamento bajo el término "Evangelio", "los Evangelios", porque ciertamente, son el corazón del Nuevo Testamento, pero tenemos que tener cuidado, porque algunas personas parecen no valorar, e incluso, rechazar las cartas de San Pablo, que forman parte de ese Nuevo Testamento.

The Passion of St. John the Baptist

A desert-dwelling, locust-eating, weed-wearing, celibate ascetic dies for marriage

Saint John Vianney was so opposed to the dances held routinely in his small town of Ars that he dedicated a small chapel in his parish church to Saint John the Baptist. At its entrance was painted, perhaps somewhat tongue in cheek, a warning of the evil effects produced by lust and drink.

"His head was the price of a dance." Saint John the Baptist's head was, indeed, the wage rendered by an older man for the satisfaction of watching a young girl dance at his birthday party. More remotely, however, John's beheading was not caused by a suggestive dance. He paid with his head for poking the bear. John denounced King Herod Antipas, to his face, for divorcing his lawful wife and taking as his own Herodias, his sister-in-law, the wife of his still living half-brother Philip. (Convoluted family blood lines also made Herodias Herod's niece.) John the Baptist died a martyr for marriage.

Saint John the Baptist, your penitential life ended abruptly when you spoke the truth to power. You did not flinch, vacillate, or equivocate. You were imprisoned and then killed for defending the dignity of marriage. Help us to be as courageous and plainspoken as you.
