# Parish Life

Dear Brothers and Sister,

Last weekend, my second Teaching sermon on the Eucharist/Mass, focused on the difference between "WATCHING" the mass and "PARTICIPATING" in the mass.

For most of us, WATCHING others is a reality of our lives. We watch TV we watch a movie at a theater, we watch our child plan hockey, etc. And many of us, are also trained to "Watch" the mass as well. Parents often




say to their children "be quiet and watch the mass... watch what the priest is doing", etc. We are often trained to go to Church as we do to a movie theater – we go in quietly, we sit quietly, we eat quietly – we do this because it's the polite thing to do.

But most of us go to Mass in the wrong way – we need to move from Watching the mass to Participating in the Mass. This is not our fault, because we have been trained to Watch and we priests have not been good at communicating what the mass is all about.

If we come to Mass to "WATCH" then we can expect people to say "it was a good homily", or "the reader did a great job", or "the music was so inspiriting", or "that cantor really has a voice that would win Canada's got talent", or "I got so much from the mass", or "I didn't get anything from the Mass." We can think of the Eucharist as being a time where we are educated, be entertained, or be inspired. But the heart of religion was not about morality, or creed - it was about WORSHIP.

Worship is giving due reverence and adoration to God, and not to anyone or anything.



Pope France reminds us: "When we do not worship God, we end up worshiping ourselves... Worship means concentrating on what is essential... we learn to reject what should not be worshiped: the god of money, the god of consumerism, the god of pleasure, the god of success, the god of self... Worship means realizing that you and God belong together to one another. It means being able to speak to Him freely and intimately,

At mass we enter into Worship, not as spectators, but as participants in an action of great value – the mass is for us the heart of Worship.

## **Presentation of the Lord - Feast**

This feast is celebrated in our Church forty days after Christmas, marking the day that Mary and Joseph would have brought Jesus into the Temple. Though Mary was pure and free from sin from the moment of her conception, and though the Son of God did not need to be redeemed, Mary and Joseph

fulfilled these ritual obligations.

At the heart of this celebration is the encounter of Simeon and Anna with the Christ Child in the Temple. It is in that holy encounter that Jesus' divinity is manifested by a human prophet for the first time. At His birth, the angels proclaimed His divinity to the shepherds, but in the Temple, Simeon was the first to understand and proclaim Jesus as the Savior of the World. He also prophesied that this salvation would be accomplished by a sword of sorrow that would pierce the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Anna, a prophetess, also came forward and "gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2:38). Thus, these ritual acts were also a moment in which Jesus' divine mission was made manifest to the world.
