

Parish Life

Dear Brothers and Sister,

Last week I started the first of my series on the Eucharist. I reminded us all that what we "Do" at our Sunday Eucharist is basically the same as it was in the early century of the church. I focused on the letter that St. Justin Martyr (155AD) wrote to the Roman Emperor explaining what Christians do on Sundays. He wrote the letter because Christians were being persecuted for false reports that in their gatherings they were drinking of blood and other strange happenings.

This is the pertinent portion of the letter by St. Justin Martyr, that speaks to the WHY the Eucharist was celebrated:

"And we afterwards continually remind each other of these things. And the wealthy among us help the needy; and we always keep together; and for all things wherewith we are supplied, we bless the Maker of all through His Son Jesus Christ, and through the Holy Ghost. And on the day called Sunday, all who live in cities or in the country gather together to one place, and the memoirs of the apostles or the writings of the prophets are read, as long as time permits; then, when the reader has ceased, the president verbally instructs, and exhorts to the imitation of these good things. Then we all rise together and pray, and, as we said before, when our prayer is ended, bread and wine and water are brought, and the president in like manner offers prayers and thanksgivings, according to his ability, and the people assent, saying Amen; and there is a distribution to each, and a participation of that over which thanks has been given, and to those who are absent a portion is sent by the deacons. And they who are well to do, and willing, give what each thinks fit; and what is collected is deposited with the president, who succours the orphans and widows and those who, through sickness or any other cause, are in want, and those who are in bonds and the strangers sojourning among us, and in a word takes care of all who are in need. But Sunday is the day on which we all hold our common assembly, because it is the first day on which God, having wrought a change in the darkness and matter, made the world; and Jesus Christ our Saviour on the same day rose from the dead."

—St. Justin Martyr

We can clearly identify what we "Do" even now in our Eucharist. Do you see the similarities? In his words above we can identify:

- The reason why we celebrate mass on Sundays to this day.
- "All" gather together for the celebration (i.e. people gathered in homes, then moved to Churches, when the persecution of Christians ended in 313AD).
- Readings were chosen from the apostles (i.e. our New Testament) and from the writings of the prophets (i.e. our Old Testament).
- The "president" (i.e. Priest) would give a verbal instruction (i.e. our Homily)
- People would "rise and pray" (i.e. our Prayers of the Faithful)
- "Bread and wine..." would be brought up (i.e. our Offertory)
- The "president would "offer prayers and thanksgivings" (i.e. i.e. our Eucharistic Prayer)
- The people (i.e. Laity) would "assent, saying Amen" (i.e. our Great Amen)
- "Then there is the distribution of each" (i.e. our Communion rite)
- "A portion is sent..." to those who are absent (i.e. our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are sent forth to give communion to our sick and elderly in their homes)
- The collection is taken for the orphans and widows and those in want (i.e. our collection)

As you can clearly see, the mass that St. Justin Martyr celebrated was celebrated almost exactly as we celebrate 2000 years later.

So what we "Do" is what was "Done". This was so that the what the Lord Jesus Christ commanded us to do, would indeed be "DONE!".

Bonfilius, Alexis, Manettus, Amideus, Hugh, Sostene, and Buonagiunta were seven successful cloth merchants from Florence, Italy. As members of a lay organization dedicated to the Blessed Mother, they were each devout in their faith. Their comradery, centered around their faith, not only united them more

fully to God, but also to each other with a holy bond and a holy mission.

Around the year 1233, it is reported that all seven of these devout men individually experienced an apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary, calling them to withdraw from the world and to devote themselves entirely to the service of God.
