In 2013, CBS 3 TV in Philadelphia reported a woman turned up alive, 13 days after her family thought they had buried her. A body identified as Sharolyn Jackson's was buried on August 3, after the Philadelphia Medical Examiner signed the death certificate. But then, on August 16, Jackson - 50 years old and very much alive - walked into a mental health facility. The family was stunned and elated, but an investigation needed to be opened to determine who was buried in the grave. A mistaken identity.

There is no mistake this Easter. Jesus dies and he rose.

There is not better news than that. Sharolyn Jackson may be alive, but one day, she will die. We all will. As Christians, we know that is not the end. We will live for eternity with our Lord. Make no mistake about it.
