Fr Liborio's Reflection

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In today's gospel, the figure of John the Baptist stands prominent. John the Baptist is a figure that we encounter every Advent. Having John the Baptist connected with Advent may sound strange for some, since he only appears in Sacred Scripture when Jesus is starting his ministry (at the age of about 30). So why is he therefore connected with Advent? In this short reflection, allow me to point out the main reason why it makes sense.

John the Baptist is a figure who invites us to "Make straight the way of the Lord". Just as he prepared the people around him for the coming of Jesus and his ministry, so too, we are called to prepare Jesus' arrival. Jesus comes to us in three different modes and Advent points to each of these ways.

First, we remember that Jesus came to us in the history of mankind. About 2000 years ago a humble pregnant woman by the name of Mary, gave birth to a son whom she named Jesus, in a lowly stable in the city of King David, called Bethlehem.

Then we remember that Jesus also comes to us in the here and now - he is with us and wants us to know that he is at our side.

Finally, we are called to remember that Jesus Christ will come again at His second coming.

In all of these three ways that Jesus comes to us we are called to prepare ourselves so that we may receive him. This is why I believe John the Baptist is one of the prominent figures during the Season of Advent.

Let us therefore prepare ourselves well during these final weeks to welcome the Lord Jesus Christ.



Workshop of Bartolo di Fredi, Adoration of the Shepherds

In this depiction of the Nativity, Mary appears larger than the other figures, to underline her role as the Mother of God.

The Child Jesus lies wrapped in swaddling clothes in a manger shaped like a sepulcher, prefiguring His sacrificial death.


A choir of angels, the star, and the dove symbol of the Holy Spirit – represent God's presence and involvement.

The shepherds appear in the scenes of the Annunciation and the Adoration.

The musical instruments and the flock of sheep recall ancient depictions of the countryside.

St. John Of The Cross

ST. JOHN OF THE CROSS, PRIEST AND DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH, DISCALCED CARMELITE

"To reach where you are not, you have to go through where you are not. To achieve everything, do not want to own anything. To come to be everything, not wanting to be anything."

St John of the Cross had a difficult life, accepting persecutions and sufferings both in his activity as a reformer and in the period of his imprisonment. 
Confirmation program and expectations will be outlined.


