Fr Liborio's Reflection

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Jesus was a man unlike other men of his day and age. Beyond what we believe to be true (that He was both fully human and fully divine), Jesus had an authority about him.

The Gospel today tells us that Jesus "taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes." This authority that Jesus had was not just in the human realm but also extended to the spiritual realm. While Jesus is teaching with authority in the synagogue, he also speaks with authority to the man who has an unclean spirit, for the unclean spirit realized this authority – it says **"I know who you are, the Holy One of God."**

In the Gospel of Mark where our Gospel is taken today (i.e. Mark 1.21-28), the great irony is that the unclean spirits fully know who Jesus is. But those who had been waiting for Messiah, they did not recognize him in the person of Jesus. The spiritual realm clearly knows who Jesus is, but in the human realm Jesus is wrapped in mystery. This is brought to light when today's Gospel ends with the words "What is this? A new teaching – with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him. At once Jesus' fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of Galilee."

Let us pray that the entire world may come to know who Jesus is and obey his teachings as it is now lived out through the Catholic Church and Its Teaching Magisterium.

On Holocaust Remembrance Day- January 27, 2021

On Holocaust Remembrance Day, Pope says remembering is an expression of humanity.

"Remembering is an expression of humanity. Remembering is a sign of civilization," the Pope said. "Remembering is a condition for a better future of peace and fraternity."

Pope Francis continued, saying, "Remembering also means being careful because these things could happen again, beginning with ideological proposals intended to save a people and ending by destroying a people and humanity." He warned that we must be attentive "to how this path of death, of extermination, and brutality begin."

The Pope's words echoed his message at last year's observance of the Day of Remembrance, when he called on everyone to mark the day by taking a moment of prayer and recollection, **"saying in our hearts, 'Never again!'"** Pope Francis appealed for remembrance of the Holocaust, saying, "In the face of this immense tragedy, indifference is Learn More not admissible and memory is due."

Learning from the Saints

Saint Josephine Bakhita



Out of Africa comes a slave, to freely serve the Master of all Black-on-black or Arab-on-black slavery normally preceded and made possible the white-on-black slavery practiced by the

colonial powers. These powers—England, France, Spain, Portugal, Italy—were not slave societies, but their colonies were. And so it happened that a little African girl was kidnapped by Arab slave traders, forced to walk six hundred miles barefoot, and sold and resold in local slave markets over a period of twelve years. She was forcibly converted from her native religion to Islam, was cruelly treated by one master after another, was whipped, tattooed, scarred, and beaten. After experiencing all the humiliations inherent to captivity, she was bought by an Italian diplomat. She had been too young, and it had been too long, so she did not know her own name and had unclear recollections of where her family would be. She, essentially, had no people. The slave traders had given her the Arabic name Bakhita, "The Fortunate," and...
