Mass Intentions:

As we begin to open our parish office, many parishioners will be anxious to have "announced" and "unannounced" mass intentions for their loved ones who have passed away. With this in mind, we are providing the information below to allow as many requests as we can accommodate. Review the information below, before you request your mass intention.

Announced Mass intentions (Single-intention and/or Multi-intention Masses):

St. Mary's parish is limited in the number of masses celebrated per week. To help provide as much ministry as we can for those who are seeking announced masses we have scheduled "single-intention" and "multi-intention" masses throughout the week.

- A single-intention mass is when an individual name (or two if it is a couple) is mentioned at the beginning of the mass.
 - Our single-intention masses are celebrated on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays.
- A multi-intention mass is when a group of names (up to 15 in total) are mentioned at the beginning of the mass.

Our multi-intention masses are celebrated on Wednesdays and Saturdays. For our **Spanish community** we have a multi-intention mass on Sundays at the 2pm.

(**Note:** Apart from the Spanish multi-intention mass, all other Sunday Masses do not have specific mass intentions.)

Since many people will be seeking single-intention and/or multi-intention masses, we will be implementing the following guidelines:

- 1. Request for mass intentions can now be processed in person or by phone, during parish office hours.
- 2. Mass intentions are accepted within a three month period and not beyond.
- 3. We are only able to accommodate requests from parishioners all others are asked to go to their local parish for their requests.

- 4. It is expected that those who request a mass intention, show up for the mass itself.
- 5. We will limit each person (family) to one "single-intention" mass per month. If a person wishes to add a second intention, they will need to add it to our "multi-intention" mass.
- 6. The names will be announced at the beginning of the mass. Therefore it is important that those who requested the mass intention be present before the mass starts if they wish to hear the name announced.
- 7. Priests will try their very best to pronounce the names correctly. But mistakes will be made and families have to realize that even though a name is mispronounced, God knows the intention.
- 8. At times a mass intention is missed, due to a variety of reasons. If this happens, please notify the parish office and the intention will be honored at the earliest available opportunity.
- 9. Sacraments are not sold or purchased. But it has been the tradition of the Catholic Church to request a donation for an announced mass intention the suggested donation is \$20.

Unannounced Mass intentions:

Parishioners are also able to request "unannounced" mass intentions. These masses do not have a scheduled date, time, or location for its celebration – it is celebrated when the priest is able. These unannounced masses are often given to local parish priests (i.e. retired priests), or to missionary priests in different parts of the world, who benefit greatly from the donations for the masses. The suggested donation for an Unannounced mass is \$10. People can request as many unannounced masses as they wish. People can be assured that each unannounced mass will be celebrated in a timely manner.

Conclusion:

We hope that this information above will guide people in their request for mass intentions and will allow as many parishioners of St. Mary's the opportunity

Vatican: US Bishops reiterate their call against federal funding for abortion

Taxpayers should not be forced to pay for elective abortions, bishops say "This is the most extreme pro-abortion appropriations bill that we have seen, effectively mandating healthcare professionals to participate in abortion, and forcing American citizens to pay for abortion with their tax dollars", reads a statement signed by Cardinal Timothy M. Dolan, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee for Religious Liberty and Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities.

Abortion is not a healthcare service, it is inhumane

"By eliminating the Hyde Amendment, and other Hyde-like policies, the financial fruits of Americans' labour would advance the destruction of the smallest, most vulnerable humans", the two prelates point out emphasizing that "abortion is not healthcare nor a 'human service' to anyone. Rather, abortion is inhumane. It is a painful death to an innocent baby, and often leaves women physically harmed and emotionally devastated", the statement continues.

Saint James, Apostle

Some footprints of today's saint, James the Greater, were preserved by Scripture. James was a member of the Twelve and of the Three; Peter, James, and John were the inner core that formed a shield of fidelity encircling Jesus Christ. James and his brother, John the Evangelist, author of the fourth Gospel, were fishermen who were called from their job on a lake to become fishers of men. It's possible that other men were called before or after James and John, and that these unknown men laughed in Christ's face, thought Him crazy, asked a thousand questions first, or just refused to follow a man they did not know and who offered no assurances. Those who said "No" to Christ are lost to history. Christ's was not an open invitation. He was on a mission and kept walking. There was a moment, and then the moment passed. James and John seized their Christ-moment with both hands and never let go. A moment became forever.

Saint James, you died a shocking and unjust death. May your courageous witness to Christ at the end of your life, and your impetuous generosity toward Him during your life, make all Catholics bold and forthright in their love of the things of God.

The Precepts of the Church

2041 The precepts of the Church are set in the context of a moral life bound to and nourished by liturgical life. the obligatory character of these positive laws decreed by the pastoral authorities is meant to guarantee to the faithful the indispensable minimum in the spirit of prayer and moral effort, in the growth in love of God and neighbor:

2042 **The first precept** ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation.") requires the faithful to participate in the Eucharistic celebration when the Christian community gathers together on the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord.

The **second precept** ("You shall confess your sins at least once a year.") ensures preparation for the Eucharist by the reception of the sacrament of reconciliation, which continues Baptism's work of conversion and forgiveness.

The **third precept** ("You shall humbly receive your Creator in Holy Communion at least during the Easter season.") guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord's Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

2043 **The fourth precept** ("You shall keep holy the holy days of obligation.") completes the Sunday observance by participation in the principal liturgical feasts which honor the mysteries of the Lord, the Virgin Mary, and the saints.

The **fifth precept** ("You shall observe the prescribed days of fasting and abstinence.") ensures the times of ascesis and penance which prepare us for the liturgical feasts; they help us acquire mastery over our instincts and freedom of heart.

The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to his abilities.

FALL SLAW WITH APPLES AND BACON

Ingredients:

- 6 tablespoons cider vinegar
- 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon red wine vinegar
- 3 tablespoons water
- 3 tablespoons oil
- 3 tablespoons minced shallots
- 2 tablespoons plus 2 teaspoons honey
- ½ teaspoon coarse salt
- Red pepper flakes, to taste
- 12 cups ⅓-inch-sliced mixed cabbage, such as red, green, and savoy
- 2 tart apples, quartered, cored, grated, shredded, or minced
- 3/4 cup small-diced celery
- 1/4 cup snipped chives
- 7 bacon slices, cooked until crisp but not burnt, crumbled

Make the dressing: measure the cider vinegar, red wine vinegar, water, oil, shallots, honey, salt, and red pepper flakes into a small bowl and whisk until combined.

Place the cabbage, apples, celery, and chives in a large bowl. Add the dressing. Toss until coated. (This can be made a day ahead and refrigerated to let the flavors mellow.)

Serve chilled or at room temperature, as you prefer (I happen to like room temperature). Just before serving, add the crumbled bacon and toss well. You'll want to taste now to adjust the oil, honey, and/or vinegar as necessary. Serve immediately — you want the bacon to still be crisp.
