


Book Discussion - (Part 3)



St Joseph: Old and New (Part 1 of 4)

In this Year of Saint Joseph, proclaimed by Pope Francis to be December 8, 2020, through December 8, 2021, Dr. Ben Akers and Taylor Kemp sit down to reflect on

the earthly father chosen by the Heavenly Father for his Son, Jesus Christ.

This four-part series will begin by looking at Joseph from the Old Testament and comparing him with Saint Joseph from the New Testament, and then move into reflections on three of Saint Joseph's titles; Guardian of the Redeemer, Patron of the Universal Church, and Patron of the Domestic Church.





Fr. Mike Schmitz goes through different scenarios that show you things you may want to confess.


We're offered two different scenarios. In one, the person is prevented from sinning due to external factors that



Growing in Grace

A missionary to Africa told the story of an elderly woman who came to faith.

Though she was blind and could neither read nor write, she wanted to share her newfound faith with others.

She went to the missionary and asked for a Bible in French. When she received it, she asked the missionary to underline the verses of **John 3:16** in red and mark the page so she could find it. The missionary later learned what she would do with the Bible.

In the afternoons, just before school let out, the woman went to the school's front door. As young people came out, she would stop and ask one if they knew how to read French. If someone replied "yes," she would ask them to read the verse marked in red in her Bible. Then she would ask, "Do you know what this means?" And she would tell them about Christ.

We have good news. God loves us so much that he gave us his only Son that we may have eternal life. This great news is not just for us alone, but for others. This is where we struggle. We need to find our way. The blind woman discovered her method; we need ours. Maybe it is simply giving someone a pamphlet to read. (Maybe this booklet?) Or we might invite someone to church. Be a missionary. Take the risk. Someone's eternity may depend on it.

Father, this is great news – we got to live for eternity. It is such great news that we are to share it, but I need help. I ask for the grace to be courageous. May I take that important step—in faith! May I bring his goodness to others.
