Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Beginning with the end we understand His greatness

Our faith is rooted in history, a miraculous history. The Passion of Jesus Christ is not a parable, analogy, or metaphor. It is not a story meant to teach us a lesson apart from its facts. It is not a morality play whose actors mean to teach a lesson. The Passion of Christ is theologically significant because it is historically true. If it were not historically true it would have no significance beyond its power to inspire as a story. But every culture already has myths to inspire its people, or at least mythical figures whose superhuman qualities model greatness. The story of Christ is so much more. It is the true story of a God-man who was betrayed by a friend, suffered calumny from His enemies, was publicly humiliated, made to carry the instrument of His own execution, and then was left to die, naked on a

rough-hewn tree. This story is not sad by analogy to another story. It is sad in and of itself. This is the story we hear every Palm Sunday. This is how a great man's life came to an end. It is also the story of how the Son of God conquered death and opened the gates of heaven to all who not only believe in Him but who belong to Him through the Catholic Church.

Growing in Grace by Fr. Thomas J. Connery

In the Ancient near east, a King entered a city riding on a warhorse in order to convey His military power - particularly when he was entering a newly conquered city - where his rule may have been regarded as illegitimate or met with suspicion or outright rejection. The exception to this custom was when a beloved king entered his own capital city. There he would ride in on a donkey - the benevolent king.

Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem in meekness and gentleness. He comes not to lord it over the people, not to impose his will upon them. He comes as the benevolent king. How do I deal with authority? We all have some level of authority - maybe at work, or within your family, or even with your pet dog. Kindness first.

Father, your Son Jesus enters The city not to dominate but to Come to die. He accepts this Final ending. He is obedient To your will. Help me to Accept your will for me, Especially when it is difficult or When I deem it unfair. Grant me the Strength and meekness to do your will.
