

### St. John Paul II (the Great), Pope

### Fully prepared, possessing every skill, a pope for the ages makes maximum impact

Thirty-three years after the dark cloud of communism had settled over Eastern Europe, on a crisp autumn night, heavy bells across Poland began to sway and toll in their high towers. Their clangs peeled down the valleys, thundered through the town squares, and reverberated off every city street. Men and women spilled like water into the streets. Songs. Candles. Prayers. Flowers. Tears. Flags. Embraces. Champagne. Could it be true? A son of Poland had been elected Pope! Pope Saint John Paul II was a titan. He was as prepared as any man before him to be pope. He was all things—a highly educated European intellectual, a philosophy professor with two Doctorates, a mystic of intense spirituality, a working bishop of a large and dynamic Archdiocese

behind the iron curtain, a Cardinal whose counsel was valued by the Pope, an active contributor at the Second Vatican Council, a polyglot, and a world traveler. Adding to this embarrassment of riches, he was an athlete and outdoorsman, had palpable charisma, an open personality, a manly presence, vast circles of lay friends, a resonant voice, and he was just 58 years old when elected. Never had a conclave of Cardinals made a bolder, wiser choice.

### Pope at Audience: Power of grace must lead to works of mercy

### **Reconciliation with God**

Sinners, he explained, are granted pardon and salvation by God through the death of Jesus, and are "welcomed by God and reconciled with Him."...

### Saved by grace

This involves faith in Christ, which for St Paul, "has an allencompassing value" that affects every aspect of the life of the Christian...

### Collaborating with works of mercy

He noted that St Paul's teaching is complemented by the teaching of St James, who wrote that "faith without works is dead." For both Apostles, "the response of faith demands that we be active in our love of God and in our love of neigbour."

### Living with the poor like Jesus: The example of Fr Júlio Lancellotti

Alongside the poor, as Christ teaches. This is what Father Júlio Lancellotti recalls from his phone call with Pope Francis last year. It's a mission reflected in the routine of the priest who each day welcomes - in his

heart and at the "Centro São Martinho" in Sao Paulo, Brazil - hundreds of people who live on the streets of the largest city in the Latin American country.

"We live beside those people who sleep on the streets of São Paulo. Today there are more than 30,000 homeless people: the number of women and children is increasing. It is a situation, as Pope Francis calls it, of a 'throw-away' mindset toward the population and especially for the poor, whose last place is the street and who end up surviving in the streets of the city."
