Learning From The Saints

Saints Simon and Jude



The Apostles laid the foundation for a later generation's household of faith

There is often a crosshatch of bloody scratches on the right cheek of statues of the suffering Christ in Latin America. It's called the "Judas Kiss," a reminder of Judas Iscariot's act of both affectionately greeting Christ and betraying Him in one sinister gesture. No one kneels before a statue of Judas Iscariot in a Catholic church. No one lights a candle to Judas asking that he restore their lost sight or heal their child's cancer. But Judas Iscariot wasn't the only Judas among the Twelve Apostles. Today's Saint Jude (or Judas) was often confused with his evil contemporary. Since Judas Iscariot was so despised and ignored, and since he shared a name with the good Jude, a tradition gathered over the centuries of petitioning today's saint

only when all other saints had failed to answer one's prayers. **Saint Jude became the Patron Saint of Hopeless Causes.** *When the dam was barely holding, when a pulse could no longer be felt, when the rains wouldn't come, a candle was lit to Saint Jude, hoping against hope, that he would respond.*



'Click To Pray' 2.0



"Click To Pray" 2.0 is an updated digital proposal that can be downloaded on iOS and Android platforms. Launched by the "Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network", the app offers users a variety of specific propositions **to pray together with Pope Francis on a daily basis**, and support the synodal process.

For those who are not familiar with the app, it features the option of receiving notifications and a wide choice of content for prayer at any moment of the day, in order to inspire people to commit fully to the intentions of the Pope and pray for the challenges facing humanity and the mission of the Church.

Available in seven languages, "Click To Pray" aims to provide a bridge between generations by promoting interaction among users by offering the chance to generate a shared community space, where each user can publish his or her intentions and share prayers throughout the entire network. It also includes a teaching tool for experiencing prayer at a more profound level.

"Click to Pray" has so far reached over 2.5 million users on all continents, allowing more than 400,000 users to pray together with Pope Francis for his prayer intentions.

Gracious God, you who are the author of all life, and who desire the well-being of all people, during these dark days of COVID-19, increase in us, respect and reverence for all human life.



Meet Juliana Taimoorazy

Nobel Peace Prize nominee and advocate for Iraqi Christians

When Juliana Taimoorazy was smuggled out of Iran as a teenager, she probably didn't expect to spend her adult life advocating for the religious freedom of women in neighboring Iraq. But — thanks to the invitation of Cardinal Francis George — that's what she's done. And now she's nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize.

The Pillar's Michelle La Rosa talked with Taimoorazy about her extraordinary life story, her work with women in Iraq, and what she's now asking of the Biden administration.

The religious teacher would try to debate me on the Holy Trinity. I was not a theologian, but as a 13-year-old, I would try to defend my faith, and I would be thrown out of class a lot. So, I have been a defender of Eastern Christianity for as long as I've known myself.
