

St. Matthew, Apostle, Evangelist

Christ passes by in every life. Everyone has their chance to say "Yes" or "No," to stay or follow, to change or remain the same. That moment may come only once and never return.

The Gospel of Matthew nowhere mentions that it is written by a man named Matthew. But it was attributed to him very early in the life of the Church. It was compiled by 80 A.D., at the latest. Matthew's Gospel is clearly written by a Jew and for Jews. It references the Old Testament repeatedly and notes how Jesus fulfilled those ancient Scriptures. Matthew's Gospel is the only one which identifies him as a tax collector.

"We were not put here just to make do, but to make something of our lives", said the Pope. He urged the young people to be heroic and to "dream fearlessly". "Please, don't let your lives just pass by", added the Pope.

Pope Francis began his address by answering three questions he was asked by some of the young people present. "I would like to try to come up with some answers to them," said the Pope.

- **Roots** "For love to be fruitful, don't forget your roots"
- Overcoming obstacles "a matter of how we see things and of looking to what really matters".
- Embracing the cross "Embracing helps us overcome fear",

4 Reasons for Dryness in Prayer

Fr. Josh Johnson gives four reasons why we may experience dryness in prayer, and they're all experiences we are probably familiar with:

Our sin: Sometimes our heart is oriented toward the wrong things, and this interferes with our ability to perceive God's presence.

We're sick and/or tired: Sometimes we just don't feel well, had a long day, and/or didn't get enough sleep. This may be inevitable, but remember that God notices our every effort to

God is simply purifying us. St. John of the Cross speaks of the dark night of the soul, where God invites us into a deeper relationship with him by depriving us even of his consoling, inspiring presence—so we learn to desire nothing but him alone.
